

NOTIFICATION FOR PACRAT PARTICIPANTS WHEN COVID-19 EXPOSURE OCCURS

All PACRAT participants are expected to notify the PACRAT COVID-19 Coordinator, in the event that they test positive for COVID-19 or they become aware that another PACRAT participant has been confirmed as having COVID-19. When such a notification occurs, the following measures will be taken:

A. Based on a reasonable assessment of the activity of the individual with confirmed COVID-19, the PACRAT COVID-19 Coordinator will seek to identify each PACRAT participant who was likely to have been within 6 feet of the infected individual of the exposure (by telephone, text message, or e-mail) and will be advised that they should seek guidance from their individual physician or from local public health officials about testing options. The individual who was the source of the exposure will not be identified.

B. In addition, the following notification will be sent to everyone that participated in the event where the exposure occurred, even if they did not appear to have close contact with the individual in question.

We have been notified an individual who has been present at (Location) has been diagnosed with COVID-19. We are notifying those individuals who appear to have had close contact with the individual, but we want to alert everyone to the possibility of exposure.

If you experience symptoms of COVID-19 illness, please inform Ulla Brunette, PACRAT COVID-19 Coordinator and contact your health care provider. PACRAT, will protect participants medical information and will disclose it only to the degree such disclosure is strictly necessary.
